TREASURER

- As of this morning (9/15/2025), our general account balance is a little over \$40K and the building fund balance is about \$38K. I'm cautiously optimistic that we'll be able to make it to the end of the year without having to dip into our endowment fund again to cover expenses.
- Speaking of our endowment account.....August was another good month. Our balance as of 8/31/2025 was \$2.066M.
- August wasn't a great month for pledge/plate income (took in \$10.5K against a \$16k budget for the month), but we are still within \$5K or our overall YTD budget. The Thrift Shop took in \$19.5K for the month and is now within \$1,000 or the YTD budget
- On the expense side.....we're up to date with our diocesan pledge and made our \$21K insurance payment for the current quarter so have just one more of those payments to make before the end of the year.
